I wanted to give teachers tools to use through designated tasks to help them learn new ways to formatively assess their students. I think the module is easy to use and has all the information teachers need. I'm not sure though if the module needs to be more specific. I'm going to be in

The module needs to be detailed so anyone can do it on their own without further explanation. I thought if it was too structured, it might stifle creativity. I think my module could have had a happy medium between the two. I think I could have put suggested times for each objective and maybe an order to complete them too. Teachers could get side tracked and focus on a particular objective longer than they should and might not complete everything I hoped they would during the PD session. The assessments I created helped me reflect on the learning that took place on that particular learning tool. It helped me think about what I learned and how ready I am to implement it in my classroom. I think I have a nice variety of resources in each module. The resources help teachers understand what the tool is, how to use it, and see how it can be used in their classroom. I think the Padlet's are nice because teachers can post questions to one another as well as to me as the instructor. We can have open dialogue as a whole group in addition to the collaborative learning taking place in the small groups. Overall, I was happy the way the module turned out and do think there is room for improvement.
